AUTHORITY

1 SA. 24:6-10 (6) He said to his men, "The LORD forbid that I should do such a thing to master, the LORD's anointed, or lift my hand against him; for he is the anointed of the LORD." (7) With these words David rebuked his men, and did not allow them to attack Saul. And Saul left the cave and went his way. (8) Then David went out of the cave and called out to Saul, "My lord the king!" When Saul looked behind him, David bowed down and prostrated himself with his face to the ground. (9) He said to Saul, "Why do you listen when men say, 'David is bent on harming you'? (10) This day you have seen with your own eyes how the LORD delivered you into my hands in the cave. Some urged me to kill you, but I spared you; I said, 'I will lot lift my hand against my master, because he is the LORD's anointed.'

MT 8:8-10 (8) The centurion replied, "Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my rood. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed. (9) For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and that one, 'Come,' and he comes. I say to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." (10) When Jesus heard this, he was astonished and said to those following him, "I tell you the truth, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith.

Mt 23:1-3 (1) Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: (2) "The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. (3) So you must obey them and do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach.

MK 1:22 The people were amazed at his teaching, because he taught them as one who had authority, not as the teachers of the law.

MK 1:27 The people were all so amazed that they asked each other, "What is this? A new teaching—and with authority! He even gives orders to evil spirits and they obey him."

MK 4:41 They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

RO 13:1-7 (1) Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no au-

thority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. (2) Consequently, he who rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. (3) For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority? Then do what is right and he will commend you. (4) For he is God's servant to do you good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword for nothing. He is God's servant, an agent of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer. (5) Therefore, it is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also because of conscience. (6) This is also why you pay taxes, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. (7) Give everyone what you owe him: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor.

EPH 5:22-24 (22) Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. **(23)** For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. **(24)** Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

TIT 2:15 These, then, are the things you should teach. Encourage and rebuke with all authority. Do not let anyone despise you.

TIT 3:1 Remind the people to be subject to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready to do whatever is good,

ATTITUDES

GE 31:1-7 (1) Jacob heard that Laban's sons were saying, "Jacob has taken everything our father owned and has gained all this wealth from what belonged to our father." (2) And Jacob noticed that Laban's attitude toward him was not what it had been. (3) Then the LORD said to Jacob, "Go back to the land of your fathers and to your relatives and I will be with you."

(4) So Jacob sent word to Rachel and Leah to come out to the fields where his flocks were. (5) He said to them, "I see that your father's attitude toward me is not what it was before, but the God of my father has been with me. (6) You know that I've worked for your father with all my strength, (7) yet your father has cheated me by changing my wages ten times. However, God has not allowed him to harm me.

1 KI 11:9-11 (9) The LORD became angry with Solomon because his heart had turned away from the LORD, the God of Israel, who had appeared to him twice. **(10)** Although he had forbidden Solomon to follow other gods, Solomon did not keep the LORD's command. **(11)** So the LORD said to Solomon, "Since this is your attitude and you have not kept my covenant and my decrees, which I command you, I will most certainly tear the kingdom away from you and give it to one of your subordinates.

EZRA 6:22 For seven days they celebrated with joy the Feast of Unleavened Bread, because the LORD had filled them with joy by changing the attitude of the king of Assyria, so that he assisted them in the work on the house of God, the God of Israel.

DA 3:19 Then Nebuchadnezzar was furious with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, and his attitude toward them changed. He ordered the furnace heated seven times hotter than usual.

PR 10:17-21 (17) He who heeds discipline shows the way to life, but whoever ignores correction leads others astray. **(18)** He who conceals his hatred has lying lips, and whoever spreads slander is a fool. **(19)** When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise. **(20)** The tongue of the righteous is choice silver, but the heart of the wicked is of little value. **(21)** The lips of the righteous nourish many, but fools die for lack of judgment.

MT 5:3-10 (3)"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (4) Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. (5) Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. (6) Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. (7) Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. (8) Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. (9) Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God. (10) Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

PHP 2:5-8 (5) Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

(6) Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, (7) but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. (8) And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself

1 TH 5:12-18 (12) Now we ask you, brothers, to respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. (13) Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. (14)And we urge you, brothers, warn those who are idle, encourage the timid, help the weak, be patient with everyone. (15) Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always try to be kind to each other and to everyone else. (16) Be joyful always; (17) pray continually; (18) give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

EPH 4:20-24 (20) You, however, did not come to know Christ that way. (21) Surely you heard of him and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. (22) You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; (23) to be made new in the attitude of your minds; (24) and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

1 PE 4:1 Therefore, since Christ suffered in his body, arm yourselves also with the same attitude, because he who has suffered in his body is done with sin.

GE 2:18 The LORD God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him."

PR 17:17 A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

PR 18:24 A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother.

PR 27:10 Do not forsake your friend and the friend of your father, and do not go to your brother's house when disaster strikes you—better a neighbor nearby than a brother far away.

PR27:17 As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another.

AM 3:3 Do two walk together unless they have agreed to do so?

ECC 4:7-12 (7) Again I saw something meaningless under the sun: (8) There was a man all alone; he had neither son nor brother. There was no end to his toil, yet his eyes were not content with his wealth. "For whom am I toiling," he asked, "and why am I depriving myself of enjoyment?" This too is meaningless— a miserable business! (9) Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their work: (10) If one falls down, his friend can help him up. But pity the man who falls and has no one to help him up! (11) Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone? (12) Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

MT 17:1 After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves.

MT 26:36-38 (36) Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." (37) He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. (38) Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me."

JOHN 15:15 I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you.

1 COR 1:9-11 (9) God, who has called you into fellowship with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful. (10) I appeal to you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another so that there may be no divisions among you and that you may be perfectly united in mind and thought. (11) My brothers, some from Chloe's household have informed me that there are quarrels among you.

2 COR 6:14-18 (14) Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? (15) What harmony is there between Christ and Belial? What does a believer have in common with an unbeliever? (16) What agreement is there between the temple of God and idols? For we are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will live with them and walk among them, and I will be their God, and they will be my people." (17) "Therefore come out from them and be separate, says the Lord. Touch no unclean thing, and I will receive you." (18) "I will be a Father to you, and you will be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty.

PHP 2:1-4 (1) If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, **(2)** then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. **(3)** Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. **(4)** Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

1 JOHN 1:3 We proclaim to you what we have see and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ.

1 JOHN 2:9 Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness.

LK 10:27-29 (27) He answered: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself."' **(28)** "You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live." **(29)** But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

SELF ACCEPTANCE

JER 1:5-8 (5) "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations." **(6)** "Ah, Sovereign LORD," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am only a child." **(7)** But the LORD said to me, "Do not say, 'I am only a child.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. **(8)** Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the LORD.

JER 18:1-6 (1) This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD: **(2)** "Go down to the potter's house, and there I will give you my message." **(3)** So I went down to the potter's house, and I saw him working at the wheel.**(4)** But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him. **(5)** Then the word of the LORD came to me: **6)**"O house of Israel, can I not do with you as this potter does?" declares the LORD. "Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand,

MATT 22:39 And the second is like it: "Love your neighbor as yourself."

EP 2:10 For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

COL 3:10 and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.

TEMPTATION

MT 4:1-11 (1) Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. (2 After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. (3) The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread." (4) Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." (5) Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. (6) "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written: " 'He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone." (7) Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." (8) Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. (9) "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me." (10) Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only." (11) Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.

PHIL 4:8 Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things.

COL 3:1-2 (1) Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.(2) Set your minds on things above, not on

JAS 1:13-15 (13) When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; **(14)** but each one is tempted when, by his own evil desire, he is dragged away and enticed. **(15)** Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth

to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

JAS 4:7-8 (7) Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. **(8)** Come near to God and he will come near to you

1 THESS 5:22 Avoid every kind of evil. (abstain from the appearance)

1 TI 6-10 (6) But godliness with contentment is great gain. (7) For we brought nothing into the work, and we can take nothing out of it. (8) But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. (9) People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. (10) For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

ANGER

PR 12:16 A fool shows his annoyance at once, but a prudent man overlooks an insult.

PR 14:29 A patient man has great understanding, but a quick-tempered man displays folly.

PR 15:1 A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

PR 19:19 A hot-tempered man must pay the penalty; if you rescue him, you will have to do it again.

PS 37:8 Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret—it leads to evil.

EP 4:26-32 (26) "In your anger do not sin": Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, (27) and do not give the devil a foothold. (28) He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need. (29) Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. (30) And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. (31) Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. (32) Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

MT 5:21-24 (21) "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' (22) But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to his brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin. But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell. (23) "Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, (24) leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift.

JAS 1:19-20 (19) My dear brothers, take note of this; Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, **(20)** for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life

COL 3:5, 8 (5) Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: . (8) But now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.

FAILURE

PR 24:16 for though a righteous man falls seven times, he rises again, but the wicked are brought down by calamity.

PS 37:23 If the LORD delights in a man's way, he makes his steps firm; though he stumble, he will not fall, for the LORD upholds him with his hand.

PS 38:1-11 (1) O LORD, do not rebuke me in your anger or discipline me in your wrath. (2) For your arrows have pierced me, and your hand has come down upon me.(3) Because of your wrath there is no health in my body; my bones have no soundness because of my sin. (4) My guilt has overwhelmed me like a burden too heavy to bear. (5) My wounds fester and are loath-some because of my sinful folly. (6) I am bowed down and brought very low; all day long I go about mourning. (7) My back is filled with searing pain; there is no health in my body. (8) I am feeble and utterly crushed; I groan in anguish of heart. (9) All my longings lie open before you, O Lord; my sighing is not hidden from you. (10) My heart pounds, my strength fails me; even the light has gone from my eyes. (11) My friends and companions avoid me because of my wounds; my neighbors stay far away.

HEB 12:4-11 (4) In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. (5) And you have forgotten that word of encouragement that addresses you as sons: "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, (6) because the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son." (7) Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as sons. For what son is not disciplined by his father? (8) If you are not disciplined (and everyone undergoes discipline), then you are illegitimate children and not true sons. (9) Moreover, we have all had human fathers who disciplined us and we respected them for it. How much more should we submit to the Father of our spirits and live! (10) Our fathers disciplined us for a little while as they thought best; but God disciplines us for our good, that we may share in his holiness. (11) No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it.

LK 15:11-32 (11) Jesus continued: "There was a man who had two sons. (12) The younger one said to his father, 'Father, give me my share of the estate.' So he divided his property between them. (13) "Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and there squandered his wealth in wild living. (14) After he had spent everything, there was a severe famine in that whole country, and he began to be in need. (15) So he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed pigs. (16) He longed to fill his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, but no one gave him anything. (17) "When he came to his senses, he said, 'How many of my father's hired men have food to spare, and here I am starving to death! (18) I will set out and go back to my father and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. (19) I am no longer worthy to be called your son; make me like one of your hired men.' (20) So he got up and went to his father. "But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him. (21) "The son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called (22) "But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. (23) Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. (24) For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate. (25) "Meanwhile, the older son was in the field. When he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. (26) So he called one of the servants and asked him what was going on. (27) 'Your brother has come,' he replied, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' (28) "The older brother became angry and refused to go in. So his father went out and pleaded with him. (29) But he answered his father, 'Look! All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. (30) But when this son of yours who has squandered your property with prostitutes comes home, you kill the fattened calf for him!' (31) "'My son,' the father said, 'you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. (32) But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found."

ANGER MANAGEMENT/CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Anger- displeasure, hostility, provoked by something.

Conflict- opposing views, opinions, or ideals, causing contention, and disharmony. To struggle to express ones desires or tendencies.

Manage- to direct or control the use of. To handle. To make submissive to ones authority to discipline.

Resolve- to make a firm decision, come to a conclusion, or mutual agreement.

Confront- come face to face, encounter, or engage, especially with defiance or hostility.

Suppress- to inhibit the expression of, keep from being revealed, to deliberately exclude.

Ground rules for handling conflict:

The enemy of resolve is to focus on others' issues. "They should, why can't you? If they would have." The success to resolving is to learn and communicate your own expectations and boundaries. Keep the focus on understanding the issue and others' point of view, not manipulating the conflict.

- 1. Show respect- do not degrade, call names, or make comparisons.
- 2. Talk out your differences, don't act them out.
- 3. Deal directly with each other- don't draw in a biased third party.
- 4. Center on the problem- don't harbor on the past or bring in irrelevant issues.
- 5. State your needs, wants, and desires clearly-don't nag, pout, or complain.
- 6. Ask for clarification- don't try to read minds or expect others to read yours.
- 7. Focus on actions and events- don't attack or judge the other person.
- 8. Maintain self control- don't use force, threats, violence or intimidation.
- 9. Recognize both sides- there may be another valid perspective.
- 10. State your limits of stress- don't just leave or walk away.
- 11. Agree to end an argument you cannot handle- don't cut off, shut down, or ignore.
- 12. Strive for mutual understanding- don't just try to get your point across.

This requires a lot of physical and emotional energy, keeping composed, negotiation, and communication. Don't pursue an argument late at night or during other events. Set a time without distractions and with a neutral mediator when possible.

^{*}Don't use statements like, "you NEVER," or "you ALWAYS," or "I always HAVE TO..." These are over exaggerated.*
