## STEPS TO BETTTER STEP FAMILIES

So how <u>does</u> a family cope with in-laws and "step" relations?

- <u>1. Re-establish order</u> first things first, get understanding on the new order of the home. it is so much easier to create before a marriage than to try it afterwards. be aware of what you're inheriting and set the pace accordingly.
- <u>2. Respect</u> never, never, never, lose respect or show disrespect to another family member. be honoring in every conversation and establish healthy boundaries.
- <u>3. Realistic expectations</u> allow for space and individual preferences. don't be demanding and choose your battles wisely. don't make mountains out of molehills!
- <u>4. Return to scripture</u>- start from the beginning with Bible based behavior. being Godly is more important than being right.

#### **HUSBAND** -

COL 3:19 Husbands, love your wives and do not be harsh with them.[23] For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. [24] Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

and extends her hands to the needy. When it snows, she has no fear for her household; for all of them are clothed in scarlet. She makes coverings for her bed; she is clothed in fine linen and purple. Her husband is respected at the city gate, where he takes his seat among the elders of the land. She makes linen garments and sells them, and supplies the merchants with sashes. She is clothed with strength and dignity; she can laugh at the days to come. She speaks with wisdom, and faithful instruction is on her tongue. She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: "Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all." Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. Give her the reward she has earned, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.

1PE 3:1 Wives, in the same way be submissive to your husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, [2] when they see the purity and reverence of your lives. [3] Your beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as braided hair and the wearing of gold jewelry and fine clothes. [4] Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight. [5] For this is the way the holy women of the past who put their hope in God used to make themselves beautiful. They were submissive to their own husbands, [6] like Sarah, who obeyed Abraham and called him her master. You are her daughters if you do what is right and do not give way to fear.

## Discipline For Children by James Dobson

Discipline is different than punishment. Discipline is learning. Punishment comes later Discipline starts at birth. The parent needs to be in control. The child will test a parent so the parent needs to be prepared for it. It is the responsibility of the parent to define the, limits for the child and understand the nature of the child. It is the responsibility of the child to yield to the parents authority.

Here are some steps to follow:

- 1. Define the boundaries
- 2. When you are defiantly challenged, respond with confident decisiveness

- 3. Distinguish between willful defiance and childish irresponsibility.
- 4. Reassure and teach after the confrontation is over.
- 5. Avoid impossible demands.
- 6. Let love be your guide.

B. A church must also have proper order by recognizing spiritual authority in Dept. heads, teachers and leaders.
