#### **Mentor Responsibilities for the Transitional Housing Program:**

- 1. Upon application, the mentor must meet with the Pastor and applicant to discuss the paperwork, background check, rules and purpose of the program.
- 2. Mentor will keep a key to the housing at all times and will meet with resident daily.

The Mentor will help lead in the following areas:

- <u>a. Spiritually</u> journey through the devotional guide questions and answers
- **b.** Work help find and keep employment.
- **c. Financial** oversee budget, spending and saving for re-entry housing.
- <u>d. Transportation</u> help resident secure driver's license, vehicle and or temporary rides to work (taxi, bus pass, etc)
- <u>e. Friends and Family</u> Mentor must monitor association with people who can help support the success, or remove those who hinder the progress of the resident.
- **f. Facilities** Mentor is responsible to help maintain the needs of the housing provided such as minor upkeep, groceries, and propane.
- 3. The mentor will communicate weekly on the progress of the resident to the Pastor.

#### RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Fill out the application for residence with copy of ID, background info, emergency contact, etc.
- 2. Complete the "Foundations" Bible study class during your stay in the program.
- 3. Volunteer at the church for at least 5 hours per week of light duties, such as cleaning, painting, etc.
- 4. Meet daily with the Pastor or check in by phone with Mentor for devotions and life planning such as GED, job searching, etc.
- 5. No loitering will be allowed during the day, and 11pm curfew will be enforced.
- 6. No additional guests will be allowed on the premises.
- 7. Church attendance is mandatory Sunday morning and Sunday eve.
- 8. Church property will not be modified, or vandalized in any way. Residence is subject to inspection at any time without notice. No key will be furnished for the resident; therefore no valuables should be left in the trailer. Staff may lock the trailer, and terminate program without notice if resident fails to communicate daily.
- 9. After securing employment, at least 50% of your take home pay will be set aside in a "launch fund". This will be held by the church and returned upon completion of the program. The church may even match this amount, (depending on availability of funds), to help with rent or transportation.
- 10. If a resident breaks the rules of the program, or leaves before completion, the funds accumulated will be forfeited.
- 11. Anew Church will not be held responsible for loss, theft, or injury in any way while on church property.
- 12. No tobacco, open flames, alcohol, or weapons of any kind are permitted.
- 13. Parking is only allowed across the street.

#### **Phase 1** (7 to 14 days)

- 1. Upon arrival and check in to the housing, you will need to inventory your personal belongings. Clothes, personal items, etc.
- 2. You will be instructed on how to use the water, propane and sewer.
- 3. You will need to wash all clothes, sheets, blankets, etc. The washer and dryer are available at the Hope Outreach day center.
- 4. You will be accountable for your time 8 hours a day. You must report to the church office by 9:00am daily, or call the office and leave a message if the staff is not available. You will check back in by 5:00pm.
- 5. You will start your day by eating breakfast and bathing before you check in with your sponsor / mentor.
- 6. Some groceries are provided in the trailer and lunch is served at 11:30 at "Our daily bread".
- 7. If you need clothes, you can work for a voucher at Hope Outreach.
- 8. Your money will be accounted for weekly. Any financial gift from friends, family, etc., will be used for living expenses.
- 9. You will work 8 hours a day trying to find a job. Job hunting is your job.

#### **Phase 2** (15 to 30 days)

- 1. After finding a job, you will work out a schedule to fulfill your additional work obligation (5 hours per week) at the church.
- 2. All scheduling will be arranged, written out, and kept on file at the church office. This includes counseling, DHS, Prob / Parole, etc.

#### **Phase 3** (31 to 90 days)

- 1. Exiting the program will be planned out by you and your sponsor/ mentor.
- 2. Communication is expected daily as you will still need to check in by phone or in person.
- 3. Final cleaning of the facilities will be taken care of before your "savings / launch fund" will be released.

- 3. Bathrooms Paper goods re-stocked, toilets and sinks cleaned, hand soap bottles full, floors swept and mopped, air freshener dispensers full.
- 4. Sweep and Mop All tile downstairs (check in desk and bathroom areas.)
- 5. Light bulbs Check all bulbs in offices, main auditorium, snack shack, lamps, entry way (lobby), bathrooms, conference room, nursery, carnival kids, bleachers, prize store, janitors closet, check in desk.
- 6. Outside Check lot for mowing, weed eating, and edging. Pick up any trash laying around lot and throw in dumpster on NW side of church. Empty outside trash bins by pavilion located N side of the church into dumpster also.
