GOD'S CALL (getting the vision / revelation)

God does not reveal himself to the masses

- Do we listen to God or listen to people for direction and purpose?
 "Thus the people were divided because of Jesus." (John 7:43 NIV)
- "...about sin, because people do not believe in me; (John 16:9 NIV)
- He said to Aaron, "What did these people do to you, that you led them into such great sin?" "Do not be angry, my lord," Aaron answered. "You know how prone these people are to evil. They said to me, 'Make us gods who will go before us. As for this fellow Moses who brought us up out of Egypt, we don't know what has happened to him.' So I told them, 'Whoever has any gold jewelry, take it off.' Then they gave me the gold, and I threw it into the fire, and out came this calf!" (Exodus 32:21-24 NIV)
- Then Peter began to speak: "I now realize how true it is that God does not show favoritism (Acts 10:34 NIV)
- 1. When God call someone he gives them a vision and revelation.
- 2. When God call someone he delegates authority to them.
- and to have authority to drive out demons. (Mark 3:15 NIV)
- They were amazed at his teaching, because his words had authority. (Luke 4:32 NIV)
- "By what authority are you doing these things?" they asked. "And who gave you authority to do this?" (Mark 11:28 NIV)
- Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20 NIV)
- 3. Those who are called by God become God's representatives or ambassadors
- Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will

fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should. (Ephesians 6:19, 20 NIV)

- We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. (2 Corinthians 5:20 NIV)
- But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. (1 Peter 2:9 NIV)
- 4. God does nothing until he first reveals it to his prophets.
- Surely the Sovereign Lord does nothing without revealing his plan to his servants the prophets. (Amos 3:7 NIV)
- 5. God always reveals himself before he reveals his plan
- 6. Rhema is the spoken word. Logos is the written word.
- 7. People often misunderstand the prophet because they are hardhearted toward God
- 8. Those who are called should never defend himself to people or try to prove their calling or authority. They do not need human approval. (Not people pleasers)
- Jesus entered the temple courts, and, while he was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him. "By what authority are you doing these things?" they asked. "And who gave you this authority?" Jesus replied, "I will also ask you one question. If you answer me, I will tell you by what authority I am doing these things. John's baptism—where did it come from? Was it from heaven, or of human origin?" They discussed it among themselves and said, "If we say, 'From heaven,' he will ask, 'Then why didn't you believe him?' But if we say, 'Of human origin'—we are afraid of the people, for they all hold that John was a prophet." So they answered Jesus, "We don't know." Then he said, "Neither will I tell you by what authority I am doing these things. (Matthew 21:23-27 NIV)
- They came to him and said, "Teacher, we know that you are a man of integrity. You aren't swayed by others, because you pay no attention to who they are; but you

teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. Is it right to pay the imperial tax to Caesar or not? (Mark 12:14 NIV)

- 9. God often gives us a vision or a revelation, then he kills it. So when he brings it to pass we cannot take the credit or the glory.

man after his own heart and appointed him ruler of his people, because you have not kept the

gone the way which the LORD sent me, and have brought Agag the king of Amalek, and have utterly destroyed the Amalekites.21 **But the people** took of the spoil, sheep and oxen, the chief of the things which should have been utterly destroyed, to sacrifice unto the LORD thy God in Gilgal.22 And Samuel said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.23 For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, he hath also rejected thee from being king.

12. Hearing and obeying God's voice brings peace and security.

Not hearing and disobeying brings anxiety and insecurity.

13. Those who are called must find and pursue a mentor or more experienced "prophet" for wisdom and delegation of responsibility.

Eli was to Samuel, Jethro was to Moses, Paul was to Timothy, etc

- 14. If a person is truly called by God they are not dependent on title or position. They can still function in the office of their calling.
- So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, (Ephesians 4:11 NIV)
- 15. God calls many people (who make excuses or disqualify themselves) but only a few take up the responsibility of leadership.
- Jesus spoke to them again in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven is like a king who prepared a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his servants to those who had been invited to the banquet to tell them to come, but they refused to come. "Then he sent some more servants and said, 'Tell those who have been invited that I have prepared my dinner: My oxen and fattened cattle have been butchered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding banquet.' "But they paid no attention and went off—one to his field, another to his business. .."For many are invited, but few are chosen." (Matthew 22:1-14 NIV)

16. A shepherds heart is different than a hireling.

A hireling blames, complains and runs away, a shepherd takes responsibility to provide and protect (improve the situation, find solutions) he stays the course. John 10:1-13 "Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. 2 The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. 3 The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. 5 But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." 6 Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.7 Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8 All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved.[a] They will come in and go out, and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.11 "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 12 The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. 13 The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

1 Peter 5:1-4 To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: 2 Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; 3 not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. 4 And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.5 In the same way, you who are younger, submit yourselves to your elders. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward

one another, because, "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble." 6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. 7 Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.8 Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour.

Baptism into Water

Every "believer" after a decision of faith should be baptized into water as an outward sign of an inward work. This symbolizes the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus and our commitment to follow Him in this way spiritually. It is not a requirement to be saved, often referred to as a "sacrament". It is an "ordinance" or a commandment by Jesus, not a suggestion.



We do not require you to be a formal member of our church, or group to participate. We all should make a public profession that we have accepted Christ. We practice immersion of adults or children who are old enough to make their own personal decision to do so. This is usually a one time event, however, if someone has strayed from their faith as an adult (prodigal), they may be rebaptized as a sign of a renewed commitment to Christ. You do not need to be baptized to show a commitment to membership in this local church. If you are a candidate for the next "Baptism Bash" or celebration, we will offer you a free dark t-shirt and a towel. You should arrive at least 15 minutes early for instructions. You will receive a certificate with a photo to commemorate this event, and a video published online to share with friends or family who may not be able to attend.

Communion

Any believer may participate in "open" communion at AnewChurch. Again, this is not a requirement for salvation (a sacrament), but it is an ordinance, or a commandment from Jesus to do this in remembrance of Him. The purpose of communion, or the Lord's Supper, is an outward sign of an inward work. The bread (or cracker) represents the broken body of Christ, and the wine (or grape juice) represent His blood that was shed for our sins. The believer also identifies themself as a part of the universal church, the Body of Christ. We will endeavor to explain the public process in a fresh, relevant way without becoming a stale ritual by the format in which we partake of the elements. This will usually happen monthly. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 22:17-20

Translations -

King James – old english, harder to understand

NIV - word for word, modern english

Todays English Version (TEV) "thought for thought" – very easy to read

between human beings and God.


Covenant—A formal, binding, and sealed agreement or contract.

It included 5 knots & 8 strands, added to 600 to remember the 613 commandments in the Torah (1st 5 books in the Bible).
- **4. "Tallith"** Hebrew word for little tent (the entire shawl) Paul made "tents" ... intimate, private and personal "go into your prayer closet", Tzitzit is the fringes and means commandments
- **5. Significant part of the burial cloth** Jn. 20:6, Then Simon Peter, who was behind him, arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen.

Witnessing & Evangelism

Many churches have grown, become bigger and better accomplished great things, and given millions to foreign missions, but still haven't been a lighthouse for lost souls.

We've become ingrown and tagged as a "hotel for saints" instead of a "hospital for sinners". Whether our emphasis is street ministry, door to door witnessing, or just sharing with a few close friends, the church is still responsible to be a living testimony, the light of the world, and the salt of the earth (Matt. 5:13-16). God is calling us to infiltrate society in government, business, the media or anywhere possible as a witness for Him. Our days of seclusion are over; let's compel them to come into God's house from every walk of life (Luke 14:23) and He will add to the church daily. The apostle Paul said he would win men by "whatever means possible" and be "all things to all men, that he might win a few". Ministry today has unlimited opportunities to share the gospel through avenues unknown to past generations. Let's take the divine mandate to reap the harvest in these last days.

MASS EVANGELISM, and CRUSADES VS.ONE-ON-ONE PERSONALWITNESSING

The Bible says that the disciples multiplied and God added to the church daily. (x +)

We know that the Devil seeks to subtract from the church and divide the believers (-%)

The average crusade or revival in the past, would bring in about 100 converts a year to a local church. Approximately 50% would stick with it and the others would "fall away".

That totals 500 people in 10 years. On the other hand, if one person wins a friend to Christ every year, and that person wins a friend to Christ every year, and so on... We would have 1,023 believers added to the church in ten years. Statistics show that when a friend or relative wins someone to the Lord and spends personal time with them, they are much more likely to "stick with it". The end-time harvest was not meant to be gathered "commercially". In other words, Billy Graham and TBN are not designed to be combines! The harvest must be "handpicked". God will not subcontract to migrant workers. The job belongs to His people and we must take a personal responsibility to do the work. We know that almost everyone likes to fish, but no-one wants to clean them. The church must "mend our nets" by keeping what we catch and be willing to get a little dirty in the process. 95% of all Christians have never won 1 person to Christ in their entire life. 5% are doing all the work.

World population and Christianity

2.18 billion. (Approximately 32% of the world, leaving 68% or about 5 billion people of the world as Non-Christian)

38 million people will die without knowing Christ.

- Every month 3,166,666 people die without knowing Christ.
- Every day 105,555 people die without knowing Christ.
- Every hour 4398 people die without knowing Christ and
- Every minute, approximately <u>73</u> people die without knowing Christ.
- And for those who just like math, approximately 1 person dies every second without knowing Christ.
- •So remember that number for how many people die every day without knowing Christ?

Can anybody tell me? If you are taking notes, you'll know that it is, 105,555.

So I want to give you another number... 49,855...

Does anyone know what that number is? It's the population of <u>Enid</u>. I want you to envision that for a moment, a people group twice the size of Enid walks into eternity NOT KNOWING CHRIST. Two whole cities the size of Enid just gone. It's staggering.

So Let's talk about Enid.... Let's assume that because we live in the Bible Belt, our stats are a little better than the worlds stats of 32%. In fact, I did some research. According to Wikipedia, about 61% of people in Enid claim some type of religious affiliation. in reality, there are approx 100 churches averaging around 100 people per church which gets us to approximately 10,000 people attending church on any given Sunday. That's approximately 20% of the population of Enid attend church. Now let's subtract that number from the population of Enid and we get 39,000 unchurched residents in Enid. So there is a range of people attending church 20% to the percentage who on the census marked the box that they are religious at 61%. Now We know that 29,000 people are not attending church here. So we actually have two groups of people to talk about.

The first group is the unchurched group of people who say the have a religious affiliation 19,000.

Then there is the second group of people who claimed no religious affiliation. 19,600 people.

This auditorium seats about 100 people. We have two services and average about 150 on any given Sunday. Our numbers are decent compared to the average church. We are over the average, but those aren't the numbers we want to focus on. I'd like us to focus on the numbers that matter to Jesus. The 39,000 people in this city who are unchurched or not Christian. Not so we can judge them but that we can lovingly invite them in to our faith community and ultimately to invite them to accept Christ. If you mistakenly believed in the past that we are somehow in a competition with the church down the street then you are very wrong. There are literally thousands of

lost people in this city who aren't attending church and are just waiting for someone, anyone to just care enough to reach out and build a relationship with them.

• raise your hand if you know more than five people who are not Christian? Ten people? 15 people? 20 people? How awesome would it be to leave that kind of spiritual legacy? To know that you invited one person and the reaching effects of it. Jesus told the disciples to go into all the world making disciples. The disciples were 12 ordinary men. Fishermen, tax collectors, doctors, carpenters, common laborers. That tiny little group of men set the world on fire. And why? Because they knew that jesus was not just their friend but their risen savior and Lord. And all but one, was martyred for it. But, you say, what can I do? I encourage you to make a list right now of five people you know or kind of know and start building a friendship with them. Let your life and the love of Christ shine thru you. Pray for God to provide an opportunity. People's lives are broken, they are in crisis, many are at the end of their rope. Some are just dissatisfied with life. You pray and I promise you God will provide the opportunity. I had a great friend. He was actually the life groups pastor at the church where Marshall and I met. And he led the life group that Marshall and I got to know each other. But he and his wife were passionate about evangelism. They found out their new neighbor was Muslim and from a different country. They hung up a map in their house and circled the country their neighbor was from, they researched the culture and religion. They prayed sincerely for their neighbors, they built a relationship with them. Invited them for meals. I've never known anyone so intentional about building a relationship so as to witness. We would come to life group and there would always be an extra empty chair. We would at some time during the group be drawn to discuss the empty chair. This empty chair represented a lost person. Somebody out there was meant for that chair and they weren't going to make it if no one asked them. We prayed over the empty chair. There are empty chairs here. Definitely chairs in first and second service. They should be full. We should be bursting at the seams with new believers.

- 2. CONVICTION A fixed or strong belief having been personally convinced "SECULAR MUSIC" "CHRISTIAN ROCK" WOMEN WEARING PANTS" "MIXED BATHING"
- **3. TRADITION** A custom or practice passed down from a previous generation. The way we do things cause that's the way we do things! "YOU FORSAKE THE COMMANDMENT OF GOD, FOR THE TRADITION OF MEN"
- **4. DOCTRINE** A principle of truth accepted by a group of people. A statement or policy about teachings. "SPEAKING IN TONGUES" "TRINITY"
- **5. RELIGIOUS JARGON** A hybrid language specialized for an exclusive group (or clique). Non-sensible, incoherent or meaningless talk. "WASHED IN THE BLOOD" "FILLED WITH THE BAPTISM"

- 6. **DISCERNMENT** To know with assurance and differentiate between divine, human, and satanic behavior (Matt. 16:21-23 / Acts 5:1-11 / Acts 16:16-18 / 1 Cor. 12:10/ 1 John 4:1-6)
- 7. **FAITH** Knowing the will and purpose of God, by claiming and helping others to claim promises of God. (Acts 11:22-24 / Rom. 4:18-21 / 1 Cor. 12:9 / Heb 11)
- 8. **MUSIC** Using your voice and / or instrument to bless God and benefit listeners. (Duet. 31:22 / 1 Sam. 16:16 / 1 Chron. 16:41-42 / 2 Chron. 5:12,13 / 2 Chron. 34:12 / Psalm 150)
- 9. **TONGUES -** Ability to pray or speak publicly in an unknown, unlearned language. (Mark 16:17 / Acts 2:1-13 / Acts 10:44-46 / Acts 19:1-7)
- 10. **MIRACLES** Serve as the human intermediary as God performs powerful acts altering the normal course of nature. (Acts 9:36-42 / Acts 19:11-20 / Acts 20:7-12 / Rom. 15:18, 19 / 1 Cor. 12:10, 28)
- 11. **CRAFTSMANSHIP** Using your hands with the God given ability to create, maintain, or care for a project, (artistically). (Exod. 30:22-25 / Exod. 31:3-11 / 2 Chron. 34:9-13 / Acts 18:2, 3)
- 12. **HEALING** The human intermediary used by God to deliver physical or emotional intervention

- 22. **PROPHECY** To proclaim the very words of God for a specific time, place, and people, bringing conviction and motivation. (Acts 2:37-40 / Acts 7:54 / Acts 26:24-29 / 1 Cor. 14:1, 3 / 1 Thess. 1:5)
- 23. **EVANGELISM** Sharing the Gospel with unbelievers and compelling them to become converted. (Acts 8:5,6 / Acts 14:21 / Acts 21:8 / Eph. 4:11-14 / 2 Tim. 4:5)
- 24. **INTERCESSION** Praying for extenuated periods of time on behalf of others needs, feeling compelled to intervene spiritually. (Luke 22:41-44 / Acts 12:12 / Col. 1:9-12 / Col. 4:12, 13 / 1 Tim. 2:1, 2 / James 5:14-16)

Spiritual gifts must not be confused with spiritual fruit. All Christians are commanded to develop the fruit in Gal. 5:22, which include love, joy, peace, patience kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control. These are not optional. Every Christian should produce every fruit. The gifts however are given in different measure to different people. God distributes them at His discretion for the benefits of everyone. It is our responsibility to develop them and let God work through us as He chooses. We must never glamorize some gifts or flatter ourselves by thinking ours are more important than others. Nor should we live in false humility by rejecting our own special abilities. (Read 1 Cor. Ch.12) Some have chosen to show off their gifts and special talents while neglecting to produce fruit. This behavior only disqualifies your Christian service to God. In Matthew Chapter 5, Jesus said, "That if we 'show off' our gifts to get recognition by men, then we will surely loose our reward in heaven." God only allows us to manage His resources for His time and His purposes. We must be thankful for being allowed to share them with others and always give God the credit and the glory.
