Renowned psychiatrist <u>Victor Frankl</u>'s premise is that 'man's <u>search for meaning'</u> is the primary motivation of his life. He speaks of :

1.the 'will to meaning' as opposed to

2. Freud's' 'will to pleasure' and

3. Friedrich Nietzsche's 'will to power'.

Jesus said "not my will, but thine be done"

Here's a story about Bruce Lee which sets the stage for this little exercise. A master martial artist asked Bruce to teach him everything Bruce knew about martial arts. Bruce held up two cups, both filled with liquid. "The first cup," said Bruce, "represents all of your knowledge about martial arts. The second cup represents all of my knowledge about martial arts. If you want to fill your cup with my knowledge, you must first empty your cup of your knowledge."

If you want to discover your true purpose in life, you must first empty your mind of all the false purposes you've been taught (including the idea that you may have no purpose at all).

To have a PURPOSE driven church, we must have a purpose driven life!

First say to yourself what you would be; and then do what you have to do.

A useless life is an early death.

Why we do not fulfill our God given purpose—

Second coming, rapture, tribulation, anti-Christ, mark of the beast <u>He has a plan for you</u> - your job, spouse, kids, church,

- Things we should plan with a purpose:
- Our spouse / healthy marriage
- Our childrens emotional and spiritual health
- Our education / career
- Our financial future /

^{Jer. 29:11} For I know the <u>plans</u> I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

^{PS 20:4} May he give you the desire of your heart and make all your <u>plans</u> succeed.

^{PS 33:10} The LORD foils the plans of the nations; he thwarts the purposes of the peoples. But the **plans** of the LORD stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations.

John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus

How to follow Gods plan:

<u>1.Be decisive</u>— Joshua said, choose you this day.

Elijah said, how long will you halt between two decisions?

<u>2. Be focused</u>— prioritize and learn to say no to lesser important things.

"Jesus set his face like a flint toward Jerusalem" (resolutely set out)

3. Don't be afraid to fail—Gideon hid in a winepress

<u>4. PUT it in writing</u>—Habakkuk 2 says to write down the vision (this will hold you accountable to progress)
