- the Bible is accurate in all its teachings.
- 9% of born-again Christians have a biblical worldview.
- 2% of born-again teenagers have a biblical worldview.

ACCORDING TO JOSH McDOWELL, BARNA RESEARCH GROUP, PEW RESEARCH CTR. :

- We are witnessing "The Last Christian Generation." (Josh McDowell)
- Only 1/3 of "church-going" teenagers say the church will play a role in their future lives.
- According to pollster George Barna: 63% of teens do not believe Jesus is God's Son.
- 60% believe all faiths teach equally valid truths
 - 51% do not believe Jesus rose from the dead.
 - 66% do not believe Satan or the Holy Spirit exist.
