Logos	Rhema
Logos, or the word of God, is all 31,173 verses of the Bible and all the subjects contained therein. It is everything God has left recorded in the Bible for our spiritual instruction – the whole counsel of God. Logos is defined as the subject matter, teaching, topic, doctrine, and overview of God's plan for the human race.	Rhema is one verse of scripture, it is the confessed word, the creative word, a single promise, utterance, phrase, command, or isolated affirmation. Logos is the Bible in its entirety; Rhema is the Bible by special application. Logos is the general word, Rhema, the specific word.

False Teaching about Logos	Practical ways to make it Rhema
1. Logos isn't powerful	1. Meditate on and speak it out loud until it comes alive in you and a part of your life.
Pastor Don's response: Show me chapter and verse. "Traditions of men make the word of God of none effect." (Matthew 15:6)	2. Keep a logos to Rhema list. Deposit scriptures in your heart that the Holy Spirit can use.
2. You can only claim a scripture if God makes it Rhema by special leading. In other words, it is not Rhema unless God supernaturally quickens you.	3. If you find a scripture that relates to your situation, use it. If you have a need find a scripture that fulfills that need.
2 Timothy 3:16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness,	4. Be lead by the Holy Spirit and open to scriptures he may quicken to you.
2 Corinthians 1:20 For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us.	5. Don't try to believe for anything beyond what is promised in scripture.
