1. Main characters in Genesis include Adam, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, and Moses.
2. Adam and Eve only had 3 kids.
3. Noah had 3 kids.
4. Noah's wife's name was Naamah.
5. Additional characters in Genesis included Cain, Able, Seth, Shem, Ham, Japheth, Sarah, Hagar, Ishmael, Esau, Rebekah, Racheal, Leah, and Rueben.
6. Ishmael caused problems because of his poor choices.
7. Sarah was honoring to Hagar.
8. Ham disrespected his Father and brought a curse on his descendants.
9. Abraham lied about his wife to the Egyptian Pharaoh.
10. Sarah was very attractive and gave birth at 90 years old.
11. Lot ran away into a cave after Sodom burnt down, and his daughters got him drunk and became pregnant by him.
12. Isaac married Racheal and Leah.
13. Jacob married Rebekah.
14. Esau was a great Hunter.
15. Jacob was changed to Israel and had 12 sons that became 12 tribes.
16. Joseph interpreted dreams in prison.
17. Joseph had a younger brother named Zebulun.
18. The Pharaoh trusted Joseph until he cheated with the Pharaoh's wife.
19. A famine spread across the land and God gave Israel wisdom to store up food.
20. Israel became slaves for 900 years.

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1. Moses was born as an Egyptian and raised by a Jewish mother.
  2. Moses was found in a 5 gallon bucket near the Mississippi river.
  3. Moses sang and danced in front of a burning bush every Sunday.
  4. Moses' mother was Ziporah, and his wife was Jochabed.

5. Jethro gave great advice to the Pharaoh.
  6. Aaron built a golden roping calf for rodeo purposes.
  7. Miriam was Jethro's daughter.
  8. People were eager to leave captivity and never wanted to return.
  9. Israelites were loyal and thankful, so they spoke well of leadership on the journey.
  10. Moses was always treated like a king.
  11. The food was better once they left Egypt.
  12. Moses had to get another set of tablets after he broke the first ones.
  13. Joshua was a great leader and support to Moses.
  14. God sent 10 plagues on Egypt. The second was boils.
  15. The 6<sup>th</sup> plague was water turned to blood.
  16. Moses' staff was called the rod of God after he threw it down.
  17. Passover was a major event which became a commemorative annual meal to celebrate deliverance and God's protection.
  18. Moses got to see the promised land.
  19. Miriam died before Aaron, who died before Moses.
  20. Joshua won his first military battle over the Amalekites.
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1. Leviticus means book of Levitical laws.
2. The main theme is Holiness or sanctification.
3. Our relationship with God must be Holy and conform to His standard.
4. Christians today are under a curse if they eat pork, shrimp or catfish.
5. Sacrifice and Offerings are laid out for Priests and individuals in detail but this has no meaning for today.
6. Moses teaches the importance and procedures for things that are unclean. These include food, diseases, animals, insects, dead bodies, birth, cleaning and many others. God's purpose of all this is to protect His people from the illnesses and diseases that come from these sources.
7. Hanukah is the annual day of atonement for Israel.

8. Laws that apply generally for living a holy life include sexual immorality, idolatry, land laws, priestly laws, religious festivals and celebrations.
  9. Aaron had four sons who were Levitical priests. 2 were scoundrels and scallywags, they died.
  10. The tabernacle was a portable place of worship. It was foreshadow of the temple.
  11. The tabernacle had to be made close to the pattern Moses gave, but not exact.
  12. People were told to bring an offering of sacrifice to the outer courtyard.
  13. Only the priest could enter the holy of holies but the people could enter the inner court.
  14. The menorah (lampstand) represents illumination or revelation for the Christian today.
  15. The priest would eat the meat from the offerings along with the showbread.
  16. The altar of incense represents our prayer and our praise to God, ascending as a sweet smelling offering.
  17. The law was replaced by grace in the New Testament.
  18. God is after a Holy Heart, but that can be ambiguous. The old testament laws reveal boundaries in major areas of life.
  19. Worship must have purpose, the tabernacle reveals meaning and purpose with each station.
  20. Ark means container, our heart is a kind of “ark of the covenant” today.
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1. The book of Numbers keeps a record of people, groups, and tribes.
2. Nadab and Abihu were the good sons of Aaron who served as Levitical priests.
3. Eleazer and Ithamar did evil in their duties and were killed.
4. Levi had 3 sons.
5. Cannan was Noah’s grandson, Hams son who was cursed and his people were Cannanites.
6. Moab and Ammon were sons of Lot, conceived by his daughters in a cave when he was drunk.
7. Eli had 3 sons named Hophni, Phinehas, and Pherb.
8. Joshua and Caleb were “spies like us” played in a movie by Dan Aykroyd and Chevy Chase in 1985.

9. Balak was king of the Moabites and hired Balaam to pronounce a curse on Israel.
  10. God had judged Israel for allowing Midianite women to corrupt Israel with idolatry and harlotry. Phinehas killed 2 corrupt people and ended a plague of judgement.
  11. Numbers helps to record the Genealogy, Legacy and Heritage left from one generation to the next.
  12. Genealogy is a mere bloodline, while a Legacy is an inheritance of property, and a Heritage is transferred character, ideals, traditions, values, blessing, and integrity.
  13. A generational curse can be handed down through family lines.
  14. God provides an inheritance and a blessing for those who are obedient.
  15. Your promised land might include a house, car, and career, or even things of greater family value.
  16. Moses was used greatly by God, and even spoke on God's behalf, but missed his ultimate promised land due to disobedience from his frustration with people.
  17. There were 2 census taken in the book of Numbers.
  18. The thrust of the book is the wilderness wanderings because of complaining and unbelief.
  19. People had the audacity to say... "we should choose a leader and go back to Egypt"
  20. A key verse for this book would be 14:11 - *"Then the Lord said to Moses: "How long will these people reject Me? And how long will they not believe Me, with all the signs which I have performed among them?"*
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1. Deuteronomy is the 6<sup>th</sup> book of the Bible.
2. Moses gives a speech and a challenge for people to embrace the covenant with God.
3. The shema is a Hebrew prayer to Listen and to Love. "Hear, O Israel: the [LORD](#) our God, the LORD is one"
4. Blessing and curses are the same as benefits and consequences.
5. Life and Death are set before you, even though we can choose, human nature is prone to fail.
6. Moses prophecies exile from the promised land in the future because he knows the peoples disobedience.
7. Our hearts are the real problem, it determines our actions.

8. The Torah is written for people who are outside of their promise looking in, waiting for God, just as Moses died on a mountain looking into the land, but could not go in.

9. We should embrace the 5 books of the law to give us boundaries of a covenant with God.

10. Joshua is appointed second in command after Moses dies.

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**Shema Hebrew prayer:**

Hear, Israel, the Lord is our God, the Lord is One

Blessed be the Name of His glorious kingdom for ever and ever.

And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

And these words that I command you today shall be in your heart.

And you shall teach them diligently to your children, and you shall speak of them

when you sit at home, and when you walk along the way, and when you lie down and when you rise up.

And you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be for frontlets between your eyes.

And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates

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And it shall come to pass if you surely listen to the commandments

that I command you today

to love the Lord your God and to serve him with all your heart and all your soul,

That I will give rain to your land, the early and the late rains,  
that you may gather in your grain, your wine and your oil.

And I will give grass in your fields for your cattle and you will eat and you will be satisfied.

Beware, lest your heart be deceived  
and you turn and serve other gods and worship them.

And anger of the Lord will blaze against you, and he will close the heavens and there will not be rain,  
and the earth will not give you its fullness,

and you will perish quickly from the good land that the Lord gives you.

So you shall put these, my words, on your heart and on your soul;  
and you shall bind them for signs on your hands, and they shall be for frontlets between your eyes.

And you shall teach them to your children, and you shall speak of them

when you sit at home, and when you walk along the way, and when you lie down and when you rise up.

And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

and do them and not follow after your heart and after your eyes  
which lead you astray.

In order to remember and do all My commandments, and be holy for your God.

I am the Lord, your God,

who lead you from the land of Egypt to be a God to you.
