## 1 Sam 17 – David vs Goliath

David said to Saul, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him." <sup>33</sup> Saul replied, "You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth." <sup>34</sup> But David said to Saul, "Your servant has been keeping his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and carried off a sheep from the flock, <sup>35</sup> I went after it, struck it and rescued the sheep from its mouth. When it turned on me, I seized it by its hair, struck it and killed it. <sup>36</sup> Your servant has killed both the lion and the bear; this uncircumcised Philistine will be like one of them, because he has defied the armies of the living God. <sup>37</sup> The LORD who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine."

Saul said to David, "Go, and the LORD be with you."

## 2 Samuel 21:15-22 - - Battles against Philistine Giants

<sup>15</sup> There was another war between the Philistines and Israel, and David and his men went and fought the Philistines. During one of the battles David grew tired. <sup>16</sup> A giant named Ishbibenob, who was carrying a bronze spear that weighed about seven and a half pounds and who was wearing a new sword, thought he could kill David. <sup>17</sup> But Abishai son of Zeruiah came to David's help, attacked the giant, and killed him. Then David's men made David promise that he would never again go out with them to battle. "You are the hope of Israel, and we don't want to lose you," they said.

- <sup>18</sup> After this there was a battle with the Philistines at Gob, during which Sibbecai from Hushah killed a giant named Saph.
- <sup>19</sup> There was another battle with the Philistines at Gob, and Elhanan son of Jair<sup>[a]</sup> from Bethlehem killed Goliath from Gath, whose spear had a shaft as thick as the bar on a weaver's loom.
- <sup>20</sup> Then there was another battle at Gath, where there was a giant who loved to fight. He had six fingers on each hand and six toes on each foot. <sup>21</sup> He defied the Israelites, and Jonathan, the son of David's brother Shammah, killed him.
- <sup>22</sup> These four were descendants of the giants of Gath, and they were killed by David and his men.
