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The Hemingway curse can be easily explained: serious clinical depression. At 29, Ernest's literary career was just taking off when his father shot himself. Ernest went on to earn a Nobel Prize, Pulitzers, wealth and international fame, but in 1961, he killed himself with a shotgun at 62 years old. Five years later, his sister Ursula, who struggled with cancer and depression, committed suicide with an overdose. Sixteen years after that, Ernest's only brother, Leicester, shot himself after learning diabetes would cost him his legs. Then, in 1996, Ernest's granddaughter, Margaux, deliberately overdosed on barbiturates on the 35th anniversary of his death.

Two-time Oscar winner Marlon Brando's family suffered from so much dysfunction it's hard not to think they were cursed. His mother suffered from alcoholism, and his first wife, Anna Kashfi, developed drug and alcohol problems after giving birth to their son Christian, who grew up to have his own drug problems. In 1990, Christian shot and killed the boyfriend of his half-sister Cheyenne and was convicted of voluntary manslaughter, serving six years of a 10-year sentence. In 1995, Cheyenne committed suicide, and in 2008 Christian died of pneumonia at 49 years old.

The recent suicide of Marie Osmond's 18-year-old son is only the latest trauma to befall the famous family. Four years ago, Marie admitted to attempting suicide after falling victim to postpartum depression. She also revealed she had been the

victim of a sexual assault at the hands of an unnamed family member. Donny, the most famous of the Osmond brothers, suffered from crippling depression after his career bombed. Another brother went bankrupt; one is fighting a brain tumor; and a third is stricken with multiple sclerosis. The eldest sons, Virl and Tom, were born deaf.

John Paul Getty, founder of Getty Oil Company, was named Forbes magazine's richest man in America in 1957. He was married five times, and one of his five children died young. But the real family curse befell his descendants. In 1971, John Paul Getty, Jr.'s wife died of a drug overdose. Then in 1973 his son, J. Paul Getty III, was kidnapped by the Italian mafia and had his ear cut off to extract a \$3.4 million ransom from Getty Sr. Getty III was so traumatized by the experience that he turned to drugs and overdosed, becoming a paraplegic. His sister, Aileen, was diagnosed with HIV in 1984.

We're not sure whom Joseph Kennedy wronged, but his descendants seem to be paying for it. His eldest son, Joseph, Jr., died in combat in 1944 and his daughter Kathleen died in a plane crash in 1948. His second son, President John F. Kennedy, was assassinated in 1963, and John's brother, Senator Robert Kennedy, was assassinated in 1968. In 1984, Robert Kennedy's son David died of a cocaine overdose. Another son, Michael, died in a skiing accident in 1997. And in 1999, JFK, Jr., his wife, Carolyn Bessette, and her sister died when the small plane he was piloting crashed into the Atlantic Ocean.

GENERATIONAL Curse???

In the most famous study, researchers followed 411 boys from South London from 1961 to 2001 and found that half of the convicted kids were accounted for by 6 percent of all families; two-thirds of them came from 10 percent of the families.

When he was 4 years old in 1969, Bobby Bogle woke up on Christmas morning to discover a single gift from his dad — a heavy metal wrench in a plain brown paper bag. Bobby might've been young, but he got the hint.

Later that day, he and his brothers used the wrench to break into a local grocery store and steal soda. When his father, a career criminal who went by the name Rooster, learned of their burglary, he smiled and said, "Yeah, that's my sons."

Rooster's pride over his children's first foray into crime was "as if celebrating a school report card with straight A's or a Little League home run"

Bobby Bogle wasn't the first to break the law in his family, and he'd by no means be the last. It was a crime spree that spanned four generations and crossed multiple states from Texas to Oregon, beginning in the early 1920s — with ancestors who were moonshiners and carnival workers — and involving hundreds of felonies covering just about every genre of lawlessness, from murder and sodomy to burglary and insurance fraud.

It wasn't enough just to be bad, the Bogles had to be transcendently wicked. They stole everything, from chickens and cows to lumber and metal and once broke into a government-run fish hatchery just to gorge on salmon. When the children were barely in middle school, they were stealing 18-wheeler big-rig semis, despite being so short that they "could barely see over the steering wheel and (their) feet hardly reached the pedals."

A landmark study in the mid-'90s by conservative think tank The Heritage Foundation, titled "The Real Root Causes of Violent Crime," concluded that most crime had its roots in broken families and "habitual deprivation of parental love." It's an opinion that's been fundamental to our understanding of human nature

since the '50s, when psychologist Harry Harlow demonstrated that a strong emotional bond with one's parents, or a "secure attachment," can make all the difference in a child's emotional and social development.

A prison contact in Oregon told Butterfield "he had a family with what he thought at the time were six members in prison. It was only after 10 years of reporting that I discovered the real total was 60."

The Bogles had many of the risk factors commonly linked to a future in crime, such as poverty, alcoholism and child abuse. One of the houses passed down through several generations of Bogles was constructed from used battery crates, which were stained with leaking acid that smelled disturbingly toxic but, as the family liked to joke, "At least it kept out the roaches."

Nobody in the family was especially bright. They murdered people and then made calls to their mother from the victim's home phone. They melted a stolen safe with an acetylene torch and then tried to spend the burnt money.

As Tracey Bogle explained to the author, "If I'd been raised in a family of doctors, I probably be a doctor. But I was raised in my family of outlaws who hated the law."

"We talk a lot about family values in this country," "The assumption seems to be that family values are always a good thing. But sometimes family values can go very, very wrong."
