TIME, TALENT, TREASURE!

TIME "Our personal resource" - wasting time is just as sinful as wasting money.

James 4:13-15 —our time is given by God

Exodus 9:5 — God's appointments

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 —A time for everything

Eph 5:16 / Col 4:5 —Redeem the time

1 Corinthians 7:29-31 —Our time is short

Luke 9:51 —Jesus respected His limited time

The average person works 8 hours a day, sleeps 8 hours a day, 8 are discretionary . .

(we must BUDGET our time) In our lifetime, the average person spends 6 years eating food, 7 years in the bathroom, 9.5 months waiting on someone else, and only 8 months at church!

Each week has 168 hours, is it possible to tithe our time? $1/10 = 16$ hours a week . . .

2 hours Sunday morning, 2 hours Sunday evening, 2 hours personal Bible study, 2 hours prayer, 2 hours visitation, 2 hours choir practice or other ministry, 2 hours witnessing.

IDLE—Lazy, not employed or busy, not in use, Wasting time (idle hands are quick to find mischief/devil's workshop)

Proverbs 31:27—the virtuous woman is not idle

Ecclesiastes 10:18—a man's house will come to ruin if he is idle

Matthew 12:36—Judgment for idleness What is Time?

1. Irreversible, continuous space between the past, present and future
- 2.The interval which separates two points in a continuum.
- 3.A system of seconds, minutes, days, months, or years which creates duration
- 2.The boundaries of a presented opportunity

TIME MANAGEMENT SURVEY

1. Do I concentrate on things URGENT, or things IMPORTANT?
2. Do I set priorities and stick to them?
3. Can I say No, and set boundaries with people?
4. Am I best described as a fireman or a planner?
5. Do I often experience anxiety even after my tasks are complete?
6. Do other peoples' CRISIS, create a CRISIS for me?
7. Do I often regret Not doing things I want to, need to, should do?
8. Do I know where I'm at, where I'm going, and how I will get there? (personally, family, job, ministry)

5. When He died, there was still multitudes who needed healing, teaching, etc. but he had priorities.

HOW TO BUDGET GOD'S TIME: Set Priorities: Having precedence, order of importance, rating things that get prior attention.

1. God— Prayer, Bible Study
2. Family/Home—Meals, school activities (relationship building)
3. Job— Mon—Fri 9-5 ?
4. Ministry / Church—Regular and special activities
5. Personal Time / Leisure—Vacation, recreation, hobbies, etc. 24 Hour Day: 8 hours sleep 8 hours work 1 hour God 2 hours family 1 hour Ministry 2 hours driving, prep 2 hours

Ability, skill, special use or purpose, gifted

DEVELOP—Process of improving quality, the progress of increasing ability. Acquire, strengthen, make better DISCIPLINE AND PRACTICE— After a spectacular performance at the symphony hall, a woman rushed up to famed violinist Fritz Kreisler and cried: "I'd give my life to play as beautifully as you do." Kreisler replied, "I did."

TREASURE Money—a commodity given in exchange for goods or services, a measure of trade for something of value Budget—Itemized summary of expenses by priority and availability. Spending within limits or boundaries

\$\$\$ Spent On . .

- 1.Shelter (including utilities) 30%
 - 2.Government / Taxes 25%
 - 3.Transportation 13%
 - 4.Food 12%
 - 5.Giving (how much to whom?) 10%
 - 6.Clothing 5%
 - 7.Debt 5%
 - 8.Recreation / Entertainment 5%
- Larry Burkett . . .The Old Testament tithe was given twice a year and 1/3 was given every 2 years, this meant you gave 23 & 1/3 % of what you have. New Testament is based on the need, (10% is a rule of thumb)

Priorities— 1.You must first take care of your own house (1 Timothy 5:8)

2. Your primary giving should be to your “storehouse”

3. Other giving / extra offerings:

a. “para-church” ministries b. People in financial need
