SAMSON—4 FAILING FORWARD

Imagine: Angel announces birth, Set apart, Strength Shackled, Hollowed eyes—Hair, Shamed. Grinding in prison, entertainment.

What do you do when you know you've blown it? Wasted opportunities. Said things you shouldn't. Done things.

Women get value from relationships: Hug and cry. Men more often: accomplishments, achievements, conquer, win!

• A MAN'S GREATEST FEAR IS <u>FAILURE</u> AND GREATEST PAIN IS REGRET.

Betrayed wife affair
Wife catches you porn.
Devastated when kids
Broken promises/do, God

Not married—could have been.
Paycheck to paycheck—never get ahead.
Miserable flat marriage—sake of kids
By this age, more, diff, better—failure.

SAMSON'S STORY SHOWS US

Just because you failed at something doesn't mean you're a failure.

• A FAILURE IS AN <u>EVENT</u>, NEVER A <u>PERSON</u>.

23 Now the rulers of the Philistines assembled to offer a great sacrifice to Dagon their god and to celebrate, saying, "Our god has delivered Samson, our enemy, into our hands." 24 When the people saw (Samson), they praised their god, saying, "Our god has delivered our enemy into our hands, the one who <u>laid waste our land</u> and <u>multiplied our slain</u>." 25 While they were in high spirits, they shouted, "Bring out Samson to entertain us." So they called Samson out of the prison, and he performed for them. Judges 16:23-25

TWO RESPONSES TO FAILURE

- THE NATURAL RESPONSE IS REMORSE.
- THE BETTER RESPONSE IS REPENTANCE.

Remorse: Feel bad. Horribe person. Got caught.

Blame: Delilah's fault, seductive, nagging Didn't want chosen, ask for strength.

Repentance: I'm sorry. My fault. God entrusted me. Blew it.

Didn't take vow seriously. Wanted it. Deserve it.

Handle it. Anger. Pride. Took steps.

Con't unain you can only report

Can't unsin—you can only repent.

~ Can't unsleep with the person you slept with.

~ Can't undo the bad deal you did.

~ Can't undo what you looked at, what you said, what you did.

Remorse is looking backward. Repentance is moving forward Don't let past failures limit future opportunities.

Remembers—Deliver people. Spirit stirred. Strength. Hair. Not feel sorry for myself. Can't change the past. Can change future.

All in—whatever I have left—glory of God.
Steps across a line! Not about me. All about God.

...When they stood him among the pillars.26 Samson said to the servant who held his hand, "Put me where I can feel the pillars that support the temple, so that I may lean against them..." 28 Then Samson prayed to the Lord, "O Sovereign Lord, remember me. O God, please strengthen me just once more... Judges 16:25b-26, 28

I'm different. 1 chance, don't need 2.

Once in his life—not about him—all about God!

WHEN A MAN IS DOWN, HE'S NOT OUT!

• EVEN IN OUR FAILURES, GOD CAN STILL ACCOMPLISH HIS <u>PURPOSES</u>.

29 Then Samson reached toward the two central pillars on which the temple stood. Bracing himself against them, his right hand on the one and his left hand on the other, 30 Samson said, "Let me die with the Philistines!" Then he pushed with all his might, and down came the temple on the rulers and all the people in it. Thus he killed many more when he died than while he lived. Judges 16:29-30

Never too late to do what God wants you to do. You may be down—not out!

Pride, anger, lust, greed, comparison, regrets, fear of failure!

Samson did what was right—easy! Gave his life one time. You're going to do is harder—not once, daily!

Paul said I die daily.

World has yet to see...

Unfortunately, it took Samson a long time to figure out.

Most of us are more like Samson. Strong on the outside—glaring weakness on the inside.

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Push down pillars and walk out of pile of regret.

It's not enough to win the public battles but you have to win the private ones!

Just as God gave Samson supernatural physical strength—he can give you supernatural spiritual strength!

For though a righteous man falls seven times, he rises again. Prov 24:16

19 A righteous man may have many troubles, but the Lord delivers him from them all. Ps 34:19

If the Lord delights in a man's way, he makes his steps firm; 24 though he stumble, he will not fall, for the Lord upholds him with his hand. Ps 37:23-24

8 Do not gloat over me, my enemy! Though I have fallen, I will rise. Though I sit in darkness, the Lord will be my light. 9 Because I have sinned against him, I will bear the Lord's wrath, until he pleads my case and establishes my right. He will bring me out into the light; I will see his righteousness. 10 Then my enemy will see it and will be covered with shame, she who said to me, "Where is the Lord your God?" My eyes will see her downfall; even now she will be trampled underfoot like mire in the streets. Mic 7:8-11
